PAPER AND CARDBOARD

YES

- newspapers, magazines, brochures, notebooks, paper and paper board packaging such as boxes from pasta, rice, salt, sugar;
- paper packaging from yoghurt, preserves, tuna, and beverages;
- cases and boxes, TetraPak beverage cartons: milk, fruit juice, wine.



NO

- dirty or oily paper and cardboard, greasy pizza boxes, chemical paper and carbon paper used for receipts, greaseproof paper for food and cold cuts, parchment paper.
- do not use plastic bags

PLASTIC

YES

- liquid containers: water and beverage bottles, bottles from personal hygiene and household cleaning products;
- plastic food packaging, trays from vacuum-packed cold cuts, polystyrene packaging, polystyrene trays from meat and fruit;
- disposable plates and cups, transparent wrap, hangers.



NO

- plastic silverware, toys, basins, buckets, watering cans, garden furniture, jugs and containers containing chemical traces or remains, for example, glue, acid, paint, thinners.

COMPOST

YES

- fruit peels, coffee grounds, leftover food, food scraps deriving from food preparation, tea bags;
- paper coffee pods, oily paper towels, shells, seeds, and pits; broken Mater-Bi bags.



NO

- "biodegradable" bags that are actually made of plastic, animal excrement and cat litter, NO to all mixed or NON-biodegradable waste.

GLASS AND METAL

YES

- drinking glasses, glass bottles and jars, tins and jars from food; tuna and meat tins;
- beverage cans, tins from legumes and fruit, aluminium trays and foil;
- aluminium caps from bottles and jars.



NO

- mirrors, window glass, Pyrex glass, porcelain, vases, crystal, ceramic of any type such as plates, pots, tea/coffee cups, traditional lightbulbs, neon tubes and energy-saving lightbulbs.

MIXED

Also called DRY WASTE

ONLY

waste composed of different types of material (toothbrushes, razor blades, pens, greaseproof and plastic-coated paper), traditional lightbulbs, rags, various ceramics, rubber and latex gloves, disposable masks, plastic silverware, animal excrement and cat litter, cigarette ends, ashes, broken toys (not electronic), cleaning residue, nappies and incontinence pads, mattress covers for people and animals, X-rays, video cassettes and CDs.

These may be disposed of as mixed waste. If this is not sufficient, use the added collection service.
